Confederate Engineer, By *Georg G. Kundahl*, 2000 University of Tennessee Press / Knoxville, TN
Training and campaigning with Captain John Morris Wampler. A fascinating account of antebellum engineering. The human dimension of an ordinary man confronting the challenges of extraordinary times.

Make Me A Map Of The Valley, By *Jedediah Hotchkiss*, 1993 Southern Methodist University Press / Dallas, TX
Stirring day-by-day account of the Civil War by perhaps the foremost mapper of the war. The journal can be called the most superior Confederate Staff Officers chronicle in existence.

Mapping For Stonewall, The Civil War Service of Jed Hotchkiss, By *William J. Miller*, 1993 Elliott & Clark Publishing, Washington, DC
Features many of Hotchkiss's most interesting maps, most reproduced for the first time here in full color. This book tells the story of Jed Hotchkiss using his letters and journals. Learn the concerns of soldiers everywhere- the disruption of prewar careers and interests. Worries about family and finances, the tragic loss of friends and the struggle to become reestablished after the war.

Second only to Matthew Brady as early American photographer and was Brady's chief photographer in the field during the early days of The Civil War. This collection includes 100 photographs, all original size.
